### PEOPLE LED PREVENTION PROJECT

Landcare NSW's People Led Prevention project empowers communities across regional NSW in developing disaster resilience and preparedness skills. Jointly funded by the Australian and NSW Governments.

## leadership - small projects

A collaboration between MC2T and Local Land Services funded a number of community leaders to undertake small projects that support and nourish the community. The projects developed:

Ripples of Change; supporting women's mental health through social connection and environmental stewardship.

Partnered with the Manning Chapter of OzFish and Manning Kayak Group.

Gayay Lagili Garden a co-designed sustainable, accessible and inclusive community space that provides skill development and employment opportunities for people with disability. Partnered with Dundaloo Enterprises

First Nations Junior Landcare Group; Commencing in 2025 working with Whitney Ridgeway from Hunter Local Land Services, this will involve a series of monthly learning circles for a group of Indigenous primary students in Forster.

Slow Food Community Singleton: increasing local food networks and security through community, engagement, education and involvement. Supporting the development of a community garden for Maitland Baptist Church and a

local Indigenous Foods workshop.
