who we are



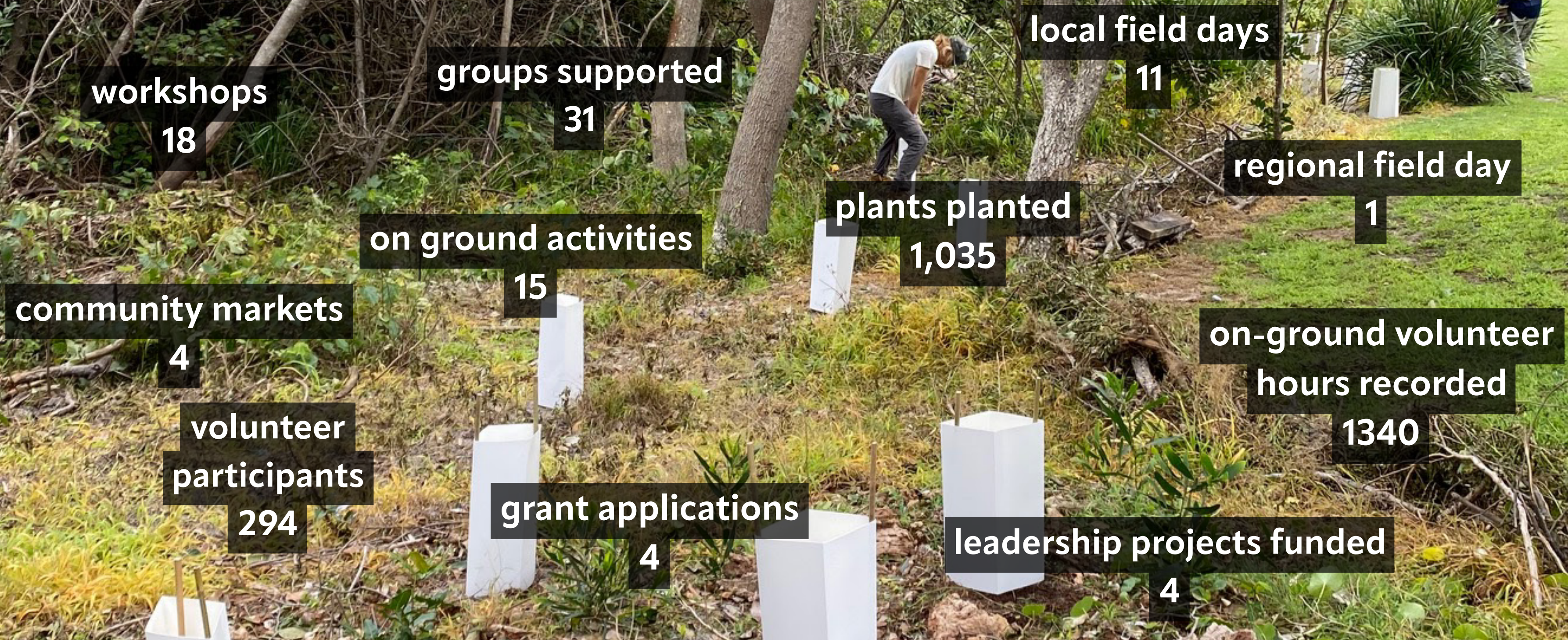
Run by volunteers for volunteers, supported by a team of dedicated staff.

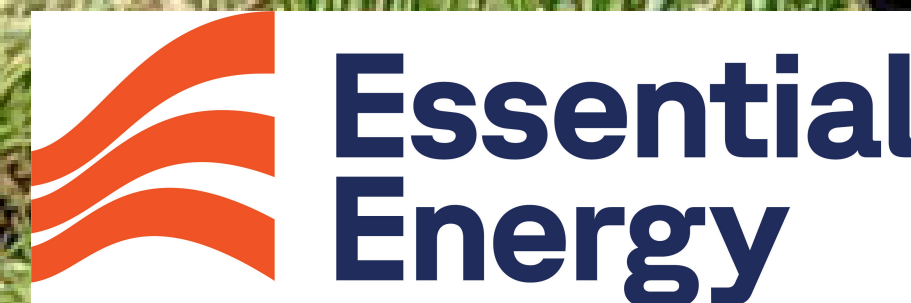

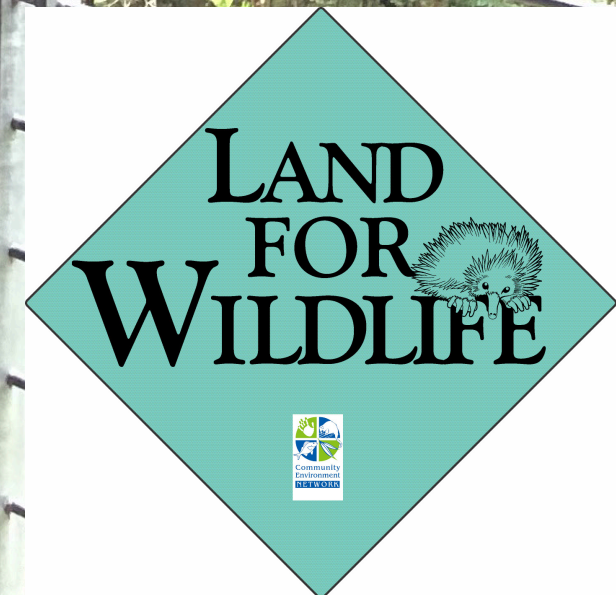

PEOPLE LED PREVENTION PROJECT

Landcare NSW's People Led Prevention project empowers communities across regional NSW in developing disaster resilience and preparedness skills. Jointly funded by the Australian and NSW Governments.

16 leadership - small projects

A collaboration between MC2T and Local Land Services funded a number of community leaders to undertake small projects that support and nourish the community. The projects developed:

Ripples of Change; supporting women's mental health through social connection and environmental stewardship. Partnered with the Manning Chapter of OzFish and Manning Kayak Group.

Gayay Lagili Garden a co-designed sustainable, accessible and inclusive community space that provides skill development and employment opportunities for people with disability. Partnered with Dundaloo Enterprises

First Nations Junior Landcare Group; Commencing in 2025 working with Whitney Ridgeway from Hunter Local Land Services, this will involve a series of monthly learning circles for a group of Indigenous primary students in Forster.

Slow Food Community Singleton: increasing local food networks and security through community, engagement, education and involvement. Supporting the development of a community garden for Maitland Baptist Church and a local Indigenous Foods workshop.
